The New Year 2023 was ushered in peacefully and happily as we joined school midway during the first week of the New Year.

The students in the Pre-Primary section have settled in to the routine of the school day. To enhance their learning, they were taken on various Field Trips to the Zoo, the BPT Gardens (for plants,) the Free Press Journal (to understand the importance of language communication,) Shankar Acharya Park (to see the compost pit) and a Mumbai Darshan too. The Nursery students were taken to the Traffic Park, the Bus Depot and the Kamala Nehru Park for their Units on Transport and the Importance of play.

The Primary section had a book fair and a face-to-face Student Led Conference where students conduced interactive games with their parents. INTERHOUSE SCIENCE BOWL A Celebration of Science

Students of Grade 11 organized and hosted Hill Spring's first Interhouse Science Bowl event on 1st March to celebrate National Science Day, which is celebrated each year on 28th February to mark the discovery of the Raman Effect by Sir C. V. Raman, a Nobel Prize winning physicist.



After a grueling multiple-choice question round – that tested each student's scientific knowledge individually – the crème de la crème was selected for the final round. The top two scorers from each grade were chosen from Flora, Aqua and Terra to represent their houses in a fierce competition of knowledge and thinking.

Every round grew with intensity, and the competition was very close. The students demonstrated their analytical and creative

thinking skills as they tackled science-related questions and riddles. Additionally, the students showcased their teamwork and collaboration skills as they worked collectively to find solutions while representing their respective houses.

Between rounds, the audience was engaged with amusing riddles and interesting questions, which added to the excitement of the event. The atmosphere was filled with curiosity and learning, embodying the heart of a scientific mind.

Each team's breadth and depth of knowledge was pushed to its limits, showcasing astute understanding of Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science and the Environment. After a neck-and-neck battle, Terra came out on top, winning the first edition of our school's Science Bowl. Overall, the event was a great success, and it provided a platform for the students to demonstrate their passion for science, teamwork, and collaboration.

HSMO 2023 Game.... Set.... Math

After months of planning, intense problem solving, and working out logistics, the Hill Spring Math Olympiad (HSMO) commenced its third edition with round one on the 4th of February 2023. It was a multiple-choice question round, where participants put on their thinking caps to solve questions critically using deductive reasoning and lateral thinking. Four Junior teams (Grades 9 and 10) and two Senior teams (Grades 11 and 12) made it to the finals.

The finals, held at Hill Spring International School on the 11th of February 2023, consisted of two rounds: Jeopardy and Buzzer. These interactive rounds brought out collaboration and exciting competition among the participants. The Jeopardy Round had questions ranging in three levels of difficulty across four areas in Mathematics: Number and Algebra, Geometry and Trigonometry, Probability and Statistics, and a Miscellaneous section, which featured mathematical problems that were based on logic. Teams made strategic decisions not only to choose their preferred area of Mathematics but also enhance their risk-taking ability while selecting an easy question of merely 10 points or gambling for a difficult one for 30 points. The Buzzer Round raised the pressure. Participants had to think quickly on their feet to hit the buzzer for 10 points. With negative 5 points for an

incorrect answer, teams raced against each other to come out on top.

The two Hill Spring International School teams took home the winners and runners-up trophies in the Junior Category. Soumya Nigam, Mahip Jain and Parth Vora displayed wonderful mathematical reasoning truly deserving the title while Anant Bhartia, Shllok Rawat and Ansh Kapoor came in close second. In the Senior Category, both the winners and runners-up were from Bombay International School.

HSMO 2023 was a meeting of minds to experience our love and the joy of mathematics: analysing and figuring out solutions to a problem was achieved by the incredible participation demonstrated by all the teams. Participants enjoyed the Olympiad with its diverse rounds and left with great joy, excited to come back next year. Ecstatic to have witnessed HSMO in person, we look forward to making this Olympiad bigger and better!

ABWA INFINITY Done Up to the Nines

Aditya Birla World Academy hosted the 9th edition of its annual team mathematics competition over the 14th and 15th of January. In November '22, students of grades 9-12 took part in the preliminary round, of which the very best were selected for the final round. An impressive 9 finalists represented Hill Spring, including Avyay Toprani who went on to win a silver certificate. With innovative competition rounds and fascinating guest lectures, the competition was a great success.

The competition itself featured 5 rounds. The first was the 'Clash of Mathematicians' where participants had to showcase two of the most fundamental characteristics of mathematics: accuracy and efficiency. With no help from teammates, each student had to answer 30 assorted questions in a suffocating 60 minutes.

Then, in 'Math Challengers', teammates were reunited to solve 10 questions at a higher difficulty. Balancing communication and problem-solving proved key.

The third round epitomised the spirit of creativity that is ubiquitous in mathematics. In 'Bulb Your Ideas', teams were only given two simple problems. It was not the difficulty of the problems that presented the challenge, but the task of presenting a creative yet well-explained solution.

Round 4, 'Pass the Baton', had each teammate working on a separate sub-problem, the answer to each of which led to the next. To score points, each teammate would have to individually succeed, exemplifying the proverb, "only as strong as the weakest link".

Finally, the crème de la crème of the first four rounds were chosen to compete in a rapid-fire, buzzer-style quiz: 'Quizzitch'. With multiple rounds, each one progressively heightening the stakes and difficulty (some even picking on the topics discussed in guest lectures), the 'Quizzitch' brought an electric atmosphere and sound finish to a weekend of celebrating mathematics.

Art connoisseur Shireen Gandhy, Director of Chemould Prescott and Atyaan Jungalwala, third generation gallerist and Founder of Chemould CoLab were Chief Guests who inaugurated the Exhibition.

Grade 12 student Keyaa Kapadia's theme was 'Layers'. She used a variety of techniques and media to analyse that theme from her own point of view. Her paintings, sculptures and mixed media pieces are a formation and representation of her identity and the original stories of her life. She has tried to effectively use the city around her and her life, hence each artwork depicts a different layer of the city that she lives in. Vanshita Doshi, a Grade 11 Visual



Art student, is exploring the theme of "Fashion" using her understanding of the contemporary fashion world. She has created artworks based on the basics of fashion and explores this theme through various mediums and techniques. She also explored human face and figure study to help her with sketching and in her upcoming artworks. Fashion Designing is a career path she has always been inclined towards, and she further wants to explore the details of this topic in a creative manner using her artistic skills.

The Grade 9 and 10 students showcased artwork which creatively and imaginatively engaged with the global issues raised by their individual topics in their IGCSE Coursework.

Their artworks send out strong messages ensuring audiences are aware of pertinent societal issues. They used multiple techniques and methods such as Lino Cut, Clay Modelling, Water colours and so on. They have each brought out their own unique perspectives, experiences, and techniques to their designs, resulting in a diverse range of pieces that offer a alimpse into their individual

worlds. Students integrated their natural skills with technical tools like Photoshop producing fascinating digital art including magazine covers, visiting cards, brochures and artworks using different tools like crop, lasso, gradient, eyedropper tool and many more. This gave them an opportunity to explore more techniques of art and step out of their comfort zone and practice other skills.

The students of Grade 6,7 and 8 focused on the Elements and Principles of Art. They had an enriching experience using a variety of art materials, Macrame, Food Art, Best of waste sculptures, Digital media, Artist's study booklets and skill-based techniques to reinforce their

understanding and concepts based in Art. They also participated in wildlife photography and a student, Ryan Vajifdar, got an award in DCP Annual Wildlife, Nature and Travel Photography.

In the PYP the students focus on their sketching/drawing skills. They inquire into artist's study-based artworks connecting works using a wide range of mediums, paints such as watercolours, poster, acrylic paints etc. The emphasis is on

their imagination and the creative process.

Young as they are, the Pre-Primary students too are encouraged to develop their individual creativity and self-expression which was seen in the display of bright colourful artworks.

The Exhibition gave Hill Spring students the confidence to pursue their career and future endeavours in the field of Visual Art and Design. They learned curatorial skills as well as how to plan and execute Art Exhibitions. The entire school came together to be a part of this wonderful experience while showcasing their creativity and true talents.

Study Visits

HERITAGE WALK Integrated Social Studies

To commemorate our 74th Republic Day and to inculcate the spirit of nationalism in our children, the school had organized a Heritage Walk for Grade 10 on 10th February and Grade 9 on 14th February 2023 to the Naval Dockyard (Lion's Gate).

During this Heritage Walk students explored the origins of Mumbai city, the advent of the European traders and the changing landscape of the city as a result.
