LESSONS IN THE DARK Antibullying

In a powerful session titled "Lessons in the Dark," students watched a curated collection of short films and real-life stories that beautifully illustrated values like kindness, courage, responsibility, and the impact of individual action.

An Iranian short film touched hearts with its message of empathy, showing how even the smallest act of kindness can transform lives. SCHOOL ANTI-BULLYING INITIATIVE


Across PYP, IGCSE, IBDP and AS Levels
