
The High School Elocution Competition witnessed the children exhibit their presence of mind and wonderful sense of humour.



Field Trips



RATANSHI PLANT NURSERY Senior KG

The Senior KG learners had the opportunity to visit Ratanshi Nursery, where they interacted with horticulturist Mrs. Shah to explore how external conditions influence plant growth. They observed a range of indoor and outdoor plants, learned about organic and chemical fertilizers, and discovered various tools and implements used in planting, including a greenhouse.

A Fire Safety Workshop was also conducted at school, reinforcing similar learning goals.

Through these diverse experiences, students gained valuable insights into the various organizations involved in disaster management during a fire and how to contact them in emergencies. They learned about different types of fires and how to mitigate their impact using fire

extinguishers. At the fire station, students observed the protocols followed by the fire department when responding to incidents and explored the equipment used by firefighters.

The workshop further built on this knowledge, teaching students about fire prevention precautions and the proper steps to take during an emergency.

Overall, these hands-on learning experiences helped students understand the importance of staying calm and taking the right actions in emergency situations.



WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

at Hill Spring International School

Each year The World Mental Health Day is celebrated worldwide on the 10th of October. The Hill Spring International School community too are cognizant of commemorating this day by unitedly coming together and involving all stake holders be it the faculty, staff, parents and students.

This year, the HSI Enrichment Centre team initiated, conceptualised and executed the campaign in school from 9th October to 14th October 2024 across students of Early Years to Grade 12.

The aim being to raise awareness about the importance of mental health wellbeing, understanding emotions for self and others, healthy ways of coping with stressors, daily challenges and much more. The teachers sported a dress code of "Green" on the commemorative day symbolising 'new beginnings' and 'new growth' which are essential elements for mental well-being.

The students were taken through presentations, discussions, videos and activities based on consciously created and customised grade appropriate themes like Components of Self Compassion, Importance of Self Care , Power of not reacting, Creating 'ME TIME'. This was followed with class discussions and reflection worksheets reinforcing the theme.

In addition as a take home a 'well-being action tool' was created for them to actively indulge in these to maintain a MENTAL HEALTH EQUILIBRIUM.















PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT A Level Staff

The 2024-25 academic year marks the inaugural year for A-level teachers, who began with great enthusiasm. In alignment with the school's commitment to fostering an effective teaching and learning environment, the staff is continuously supported through training to address diverse student needs. On December 2, 2024, the school counselor, Ms. Reetu Seth, conducted a workshop for A-level teachers titled "Embracing Neurodiversity by Demystifying Learning Difficulties." The session focused on identifying signs and symptoms of neurodiverse learners, such as those with Specific Learning Difficulties and ADHD. It concluded with an interactive discussion on strategies to support both neurotypical and neurodiverse students, reinforcing the school's inclusive approach.



STUDY SKILLS WORKSHOP Grade 6

For Grade 6 students, this year marks both the foundation of their IGCSE journey and the transition from PYP. As they step into a more structured academic environment, they face formal assessments for the first time. To support their transition, an interactive workshop titled 'From Study to Success: Essential Examination Skills' was conducted across two sessions on November 11th and 26th, 2024. Led by Ms. Reetu Seth (School Counsellor & Clinical Psychologist) and her team, the workshop introduced effective learning strategies and study techniques to help students succeed in Grade 6 and prepare for assessments. The students explored their individual learning styles—Visual, Auditory, and Kinesthetic—and learned strategies to make their learning more effective. Additionally, they were educated on the do's and don'ts of assessments and the importance of healthy habits like eating well, staying hydrated, and getting enough sleep. The workshop was well-received, with students actively applying the strategies in group tasks.



SENSORY PLAY SESSION Junior KG

The Enrichment Centre hosted a fun and engaging Sensory Play session for Junior KG learners, designed to stimulate all five senses. The session featured interactive stations such as the Mystery Box, where children guessed objects by touch; a Texture Walk, allowing them to explore different surfaces barefoot; and "What's That Smell and Taste?", where they identified various scents and flavors. Creative activities included Clay Fish Making, while "Save the Ocean" introduced water play and raised environmental awareness, and "Treat the Fishes" encouraged empathy for sea animals. This well-curated event sparked curiosity, sensory exploration, and joyful learning in a playful, enriching environment.



SHAPING CREATIVITY A Hands-On Clay Workshop

On 14th December 2024, art students embarked on a creative journey during a clay workshop led by renowned sculptor Ms. Jaymala Joshi. Known for her expertise in traditional techniques, Ms. Joshi introduced participants to the art of coiling, slab making, pinching, and kneading clay. 
SEAWORLD SUMMATIVE Junior KG
